Those businesses each recorded several noise complaints each year, receiving sometimes the highest number of noise complaints of any business in town.

The restaurant is surrounded by residential property. We are concerned that while the noise level from Stingray has been palatable, we have no guarantee that future businesses or future Stingray uses of the property will be as peaceful.

If the patio is allowed, strict restrictions must be placed on current and future uses.

Other than the "legal notice," which re-stated the city ordinance, we have not received any specifics from Stingray regarding the business' proposed patio such as its location, usage or hours of use. We hope the business will improve its communication with neighbors.

If the patio is anything like the one at Obie's Restaurant, the ambient noise emanating from the deck without any music during the late-night hours makes it impractical – at times impossible – for neighbors to sleep with the windows open. Just ask persons living in the Edgewater House.

Another problem is trash and debris. While Stingray has been good at clearing its parking area of debris, the restaurant's staff has been using a leaf blower to blow trash into the neighboring yards. Just take a look at the rear of 49 Lake Avenue, the residential property adjacent to the restaurant's parking lot.

We hope the restaurant will make a better effort to remove the trash rather than blow it from the property – especially if a patio is built. The patio must be designed so that trash cannot be easily swept off the deck and onto the adjacent street, sidewalk or neighboring properties.






