On July 26, 2007, DFC Martin was alerted by Worcester County Child Protective Services of suspicious circumstances involving Christy Lynn Freeman. DFC Martin learned that Freeman was carrying a 36 week old placenta in her womb that did not contain a fetus. At the time Freeman had no explanation as to the whereabouts of the fetus/infant.

During the evening of 7/25/07 Freeman was vomiting, had severe cramps, and bowel movements that contained an orange-brown fluid while at her residence, 209 Sunset Drive, upstairs apartment, Ocean City, Worcester Co., MD 21842. Freeman lives at 209 Sunset Drive with Raymond Woodward Godman Jr. Freeman and Godman are paramours. Ocean City EMS and Ocean City Police responded to the residence on 7/26/07 at 1:00 AM to treat Freeman for abdominal pain and vomiting. Upon arrival Ocean City EMS discovered Freeman lying on the sofa. Freeman had a garbage bag and towels under her vaginal area. Godman stated Freeman had passed out in the bathroom and he carried her to the sofa. Godman said Freeman was in and out of consciousness. Freeman had heavy vaginal bleeding. Freeman denied being pregnant or having any knowledge of pregnancy.

Ocean City EMS transported Freeman to Atlantic General Hospital (AGH). Freeman was admitted to AGH. Freeman had projectile vomiting and received 8 units of blood while at AGH. Physicians learned that Freeman was pregnant through testing, but she continued to deny ever being pregnant.

Freeman was transported to Peninsula Regional Medical Center (PRMC) for further treatment. PRMC physicians found what they approximated to be between a thirty to thirty-six week old placenta inside Freeman's womb with an irregular cut to the umbilical cord. There was no fetus/infant inside Freeman's womb. Freeman continued to say she was not pregnant. Freeman had 12 bruised areas to the left side of her body (including inner thigh, stomach and leg) and 7 bruised areas to the right side of her body (including inner thigh and forearm).

After DFC Martin spoke with Freeman, she relayed the following events. Freeman said she had a infant while at 209 Sunset Drive, upstairs apartment. Freeman referred to the infant as, "gloopyity glop." Freeman said she pushed on the infant and umbilical cord snapped. Freeman said the infant was deformed and deceased. Freeman did not see any hands or feet. Freeman said she flushed the infant down the toilet. Freeman was later treated by Ocean City EMS, as described above, after flushing the infant down the toilet. Based upon Freemans statements, Freeman never attempted to provide any type of medical treatment for the fetus/infant.

Freeman never mentioned having an infant to the on scene EMS or police officers.

Based upon the above information DFC Speigle, applied for a Search and Seizure warrant for 209 Sunset Drive, upstairs apartment. The Search and Seizure warrant was executed by the Ocean City Police Department Forensic Services Unit. Crime Scene Technician (CST) Sgt. Mark Paddack, CST Sharon Schultz, and CST Robert Lockett executed the Search and Seizure Warrant.

During the execution of the Search and Seizure warrant CST Lockett advised FSU located a large chest in the living room of the upstairs of the apartment. CST Lockett advised when he opened the chest he observed neatly folded clothing. CST Lockett advised after the clothing was removed there were three bags discovered in the bottom of the chest. Inside two of the bags FSU located what they believed to be human remains from an infant. The suspected human remains were later taken to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner in Baltimore. Dr. Greenberg determined the contents of the two bags located in the chest were human remains.

On July 27, 2007, I (Detective Vicki Martin) interviewed Freeman. Freeman was read her rights and agreed to speak with me. Freeman explained that she couldn't decide whether or not to talk. Freeman had twelve hours to think about it and realized she needed to talk. "I am doing it for my kids, so you will leave them alone."

Freeman stated the human remains found in the chest were twins that she believes she gave birth to in 2004. Freeman couldn't be sure of the exact date. Freeman advised the first twin she gave birth to may have been alive. Freeman said she placed the first twin in a towel and covered it up.

I asked Freeman if Twin One was dead or alive. Freeman replied, "Don't know." I asked Freeman if she checked if the baby was alive. Freeman stated, "I didn't check." I asked Freeman if she provided pre natal care, 911 or EMS. Freeman replied, "No." I asked if that was because it meant nothing. Freeman replied, "Yes."

On July 30, 2007, I interviewed Freeman. Freeman was read her rights and agreed to speak with me. I stated the first twin was alive. Freeman nodded in agreement and said, "Yea."

During the interview Freeman admitted to sitting on the toilet in her home at 209 Sunset Drive, Ocean City, Worcester County, Maryland. Freeman gave birth to Twin One while on the toilet. Freeman let Twin One fall into the water and did not remove Twin One from the water until it was dead. Once Twin One was dead, Freeman removed Twin One from the water; placed it on a towel she had at her feet; covered Twin One up in the towel; then threw Twin One under the sink. Freeman would then, knowing when her family was not around, place Twin One in a bag. Freeman then placed the bag outside under the snow plow.

Freeman stated she took full responsibility for what she did. Freeman wanted me to leave her children alone. Freeman stated she was more afraid of what Ray and the kids were feeling, not what was happening with the police.

On August 2, 2007, DFC Shawn Jones spoke with Dr. Tasha Greenberg of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Greenberg completed the autopsy on Twin One. Dr. Greenberg advised the remains are consistent with that of a full term or near full term infant.

Therefore, I pray a warrant be issued for Christy L. Freeman containing the charge of First Degree Murder.

All above events occurred in Ocean City, Worcester County, Maryland.
